First Mate Safe Return®

A boating safety course offered exclusively by the Sodus Bay Maritime Captains Association



As a First Mate aboard your boat, just how familiar are you with its operation? What if the Skipper should become disabled? Would you know what to do? Would you know how to call for help? Would you be able to tell rescuers where you are? Would you be able to navigate to a safe port?

The *First Mate Safe Return* course is designed to teach fundamental skills that will enable a First Mate to do the right thing if the Skipper should become disabled for whatever reason. The course will be taught by Coast Guard Licensed Captains and will include a half-day classroom lecture and on-the-water coaching and demonstration on your own boat. The schedule for the half-day classroom lecture is:

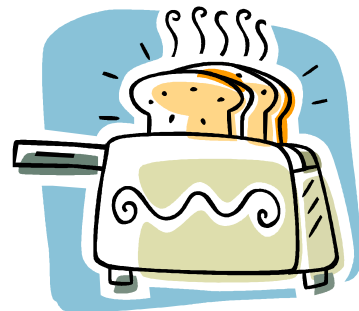

Bylaw Change, Article III-Q Addition

The Executive Board proposes the following amendment for approval of the membership at the March 4, 2010 membership meeting. Voting will be by written ballot.

This announcement serves as the 15 day notice required in the GYC By-Laws ART. II. F.

The Executive Board gratefully acknowledges the hard work and hours of discussion by the Constitution and By-Laws Review Committee which took place during the preparation of this proposal.

The following By-Law article, paragraph “Q” to be added:

ARTICLE III – Q, CLUB PROPERTY AND FACILITIES

Any member assigned a dock at GYC for a boat which did not comply with these boat draft limitations at the time this bylaw was amended on May 1, 2008 is hereby exempt from those limitations for that specific boat providing it occupies an assigned GYC dock during consecutive seasons subsequent to May 1, 2008. This exemption is not transferable and shall have no effect on any club policy concerning water depth or dredging.
